# ACRC Facility Rentals

### Family Aquatic Center

The Rec Center located in downtown Arkansas City, Kansas at 225 East Fifth Avenue and is open for general use, subject to event scheduling. #### **Registration Information**

Pre-registration is required for all ACRC activities. Registrations are held at the Rec Center, 225 East Fifth Avenue . Program fees must accompany registrations. Anyone residing in USD 470 area is eligible to participate in any Commission sponsored activity. In order to meet the demand for service provided to non-residents of USD 470 school district, out-of-district residents will be assessed a slightly higher fee than residents who live within USD 470 boundaries. No refund will be issued after practice has begun or after the class has started or supplies have been ordered. Please contact ACRC Director for information regarding financial assistance.

# SPORTS COMPLEX




